60% of adults in Canada are unable to obtain, understand and act upon health information and services and to make appropriate health decisions on their own. Seniors, immigrants and unemployed people have, on average, lower levels of health literacy skills (Health Literacy in Canada: A Healthy Understanding – Canadian Council on Learning, 2008). We can consider health literacy from the public health standpoint as a personal and community asset to be built through health education and promotion interventions (Nutbeam 2008; Smith, 2009). Specifically, there is notable opportunity for community-based interventions to promote functional health literacy using the public health model of health literacy.

Health Literacy - Caring for Kids New to Canada

In September 2007, the Canadian Council on Learning published Health Literacy in Canada: Initial results from the International Adult Literacy and Skills Survey.1 From this report we learned: 1) While Canadians have higher levels of health literacy than Americans, 60% of adults in Canada lack the capacity to obtain, understand and act upon health information and services and to make appropriate health decisions on their own; 2) Average health literacy varies significantly by province and ...

A Vision for a Health Literate Canada: Report of the ...

Health literacy involves understanding and ability to judge, sift and use information provided in the context of one's own life—this is the key element of critical health literacy as put forward by Don Nutbeam (Nutbeam, 2001). It is important to clarify the issue of power in the health literacy debate, in order that the promotion of health literacy does not focus just on compliance issues.

Mental health literacy in the junior high and high school setting can be defined as having four unique but integrated components: understanding how to foster and maintain good mental health; understanding mental disorders and their treatments; decreasing stigma; and; seeking help effectively.
